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Plaintiff, a minor, by and through his Guardian ad Litem, Teresa Hernandez, alleges as follows:

This Complaint is filed to permit the ex parte appointment of a Guardian ad

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Litem in and for an arbitration action brought under contract within the Kaiser Permanente Member Arbitrations system and administered by the Office of Independent Administrator:

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Jesus Maldonado, et al. v. Kaiser/Permanente, et al., Arbitration No. 12090. CCP Sections

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372, 373.

- 2. The named defendants/Respondents Kaiser Foundation Hospitals and Kaiser Foundation Health Plan Inc. are non-profit corporations and defendant The Permanente Medical Group Inc. is a professional corporation.
 - 3. Defendants' principal place of business is Alameda County.
- 4. Plaintiff/Claimant was required to provide defendants/respondents with notice of their claims under the Rules of the Kaiser Permanente Arbitration System and did so timely. The arbitration is proceeding through discovery. An Arbitration Hearing is scheduled to commence June 4, 2014 before neutral arbitrator the Hon. Robert A Baines (Judge Ret.) at JAMS, Inc. in Walnut Creek, CA.
- 5. Jesus Maldonado, a minor, born July 5. by and through his mother and Guardian ad Litem, Teresa Hernandez, contends as follows:
 - A. On February 3, 2011, claimant Jesus Maldonado (then age 14) injured his left hand and wrist playing soccer at Alhambra High School in Martinez. He first presented to Kaiser Hospital-Walnut Creek the next day, Friday, February 4. X-rays of the wrist showed a scaphoid fracture. A splint was applied and he was discharged home.
 - Cater that day, February 4, he was returned to Kaiser in the early evening, complaining of left wrist pain. He was administered two intra muscular injections into his buttocks, one on the right side and the other on the left. Hydromorphone (Dilaudid) was injected into the right buttock; Promethasene was injected into the left buttock. The injection in the right buttock was painful and the site bled freely. The left buttock injection was uneventful. Maldonado's parents, Jose Conchas and Teresa Hernandez, were both present when the injections were administered. The splint was replaced and the patient discharged to the care of his parents. Jesus was unable to walk out

of	the	Emergency	Department	following	the	injections,	with	almost
immediate pain in his right buttock and in his right foot.								

- C. On Saturday, February 5, 2011, Jesus stayed at home. His right buttock hurt, he could barely walk; he felt shaky, hallucinating at times and his right foot was painful.
- D. On Sunday, February 6, 2011, Jesus returned to Kaiser-Walnut Creek. The history provided included fever/chills, body aches, tachycardia to the 140's, chest pain, right foot pain and swelling of the left fingers. He was febrile with a temperature of 102.9. The examination showed the right upper gluteal region was erythematous with induration of tissue. It was very tender with movement and to touch. With a sepsis-like picture, Jesus was admitted. Blood cultures were drawn and proved positive for Group A Beta Hemolytic Streptococcus (strep pyogenes) isolated.
- E. On February 7. Jesus was transferred to Kaiser Hospital-Oakland. A central line had been placed. He was receiving Vancomycin/Clindamycin. It was noted the patient had an obvious cellulitis at his right buttock and chinical/radiographic suspicion for hematogenous osteomyelitis of the right first metatarsal base/growth plate. (Formation of pus within the bones.)
- F. There was a pediatric infectious disease consult by Dr. Tara Greenhow on February 7, 2011. Her thought was that the likely introduction of the Group A Streptococcus toxic shock was at the site of injection into the right buttock, given the time course and surrounding erythema.
- G. MRIs of the left forearm and hand were performed on February 10 and 12, 2011, suggestive of probable wrist joint sepsis, probable osteomyelitis and abscesses of the hand/wrist. Surgery was recommended.
