- 2. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and based thereon alleges, that Defendant SOCAL PERMANENTE MEDICAL GROUP dba KAISER PERMANENTE (hereinafter "Defendant Kaiser") is, and at all times relevant herein was, a corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of California and is conducting business therein.
- 3. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and based thereon alleges, that Defendant SECURITAS SECURITY SERVICE USA, INC. dba SECURITAS (hereinafter "Defendant Securitas") is, and at all times relevant herein was, a corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of Delaware and is conducting business within the state of California.
- 4. This court is the proper court for trial in this action in that the actions and omissions of the Defendants as alleged herein were made within this Court's jurisdictional area.
- 5. Plaintiff is ignorant of the true names and capacities of defendants sued herein as DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, and therefore sues these defendants by such fictitious names pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure §474. Plaintiff will amend this complaint to allege their true names and capacities when ascertained. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and based thereon alleges, that each of the fictitiously named defendants are responsible in some manner for the occurrences herein alleged, and that plaintiff's injuries as herein alleged were proximately caused by the actions and/or inactions of these defendants.
- 6. Whenever in this Complaint reference is made to "Defendants, and each of them," such allegation shall be deemed to mean the acts of Defendants acting individually, jointly, and/or severally.
- 7. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and based thereon alleges, that at all times mentioned herein, each of the defendants was the agent, servant and employee, alter ego, joint employer, co venturer and co conspirator of each of the remaining defendants, and was at all times herein mentioned, acting within the course, scope, purpose, consent, knowledge, ratification, and

authorization of such agency, employment, joint venture, integrated enterprise, and conspiracy with respect to the acts and wrongful conduct alleged herein, so that each is responsible for the wrongful acts of the other Defendants. Upon that information and belief, all Defendants are responsible in some manner for the events described herein and are liable to Plaintiff for the damages they have incurred.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS COMMON TO ALL CAUSES OF ACTION

- 8. At all times relevant to this action, the Plaintiff was a patient and member of Defendant Kaiser.
- 9. On or about March 29, 2016, Plaintiff visited Defendant Kaiser's facility located at 5105 Goldleaf Circle, Los Angeles, California 90017, for the purpose of picking up medical documents from her treating physician.
- 10. Plaintiff, a disabled person suffering from PTSD and Major Depression, walked into the facility with her service animal, a dog known as "Ruby."
- 11. Upon entering the facility, Plaintiff made her way to an elevator in order to see her physician on a higher floor. During the relevant time, Defendant Kaiser had contracted Defendant Securitas to protect Defendant Kaiser's property, employees and patients. This included requiring Defendant Securitas to supply security officers to monitor the facility and keep Defendant Kaiser's employees and patients free from harm and harassment. One of Defendant Securitas' security officers, Will Chisholm (hereinafter "Mr. Chisholm") approached Plaintiff and improperly instructed Plaintiff that her service animal was not allowed inside the building. Despite Plaintiff's efforts to inform him that "Ruby" was her service animal, Mr. Chisholm specifically told Plaintiff that her "dog was not a service animal" and "may be full of fleas." Mr. Chisholm's then followed Plaintiff into the elevator and berated her for bringing her service animal in the building. Despite Plaintiff's request that Mr. Chisholm not enter into the elevator, he continued to follow the Plaintiff and continue his rant. Thus,

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Mr. Chisholm's actions exacerbated the Plaintiff's disabilities and put her in fear of imminent attack.

Mr. Chisholm then inexplicably called the Los Angeles County Sherriff's Department to have Plaintiff arrested and/or removed from the building.

- 12. Plaintiff hurriedly retrieved her medical documents and proceeded to the downstairs lobby area. Fearful, Plaintiff made a supervisor of Defendant Kaiser aware of the situation. Shortly thereafter, an unidentified supervisor from Defendant Securitas discussed the events with Plaintiff and shockingly, explained that Mr. Chisholm was "doing his job." Moreover, a different supervisor, an unidentified employee of Defendant Kaiser, informed Plaintiff that Mr. Chisholm was "enforcing policy." Shaken, Plaintiff explained to both of Defendants' supervisors that any policy that forbids a disabled person from bringing her service dog into a public place is unlawful on its face.
- 13. Shortly thereafter, a deputy officer from the los Angeles County Sherriff's Department arrived at the scene and had a brief conversation with Plaintiff. As a result of the panic, anxiety and overall emotional toll of the events she experienced Plaintiff had no other option but to travel directly to her residence in an effort to recover.
- 14. On or about April 21, 2016, Plaintiff was again unlawfully subjected to discrimination at the hands of Defendant Kaiser. Specifically, during the course of her treatment with Dr. Allen Wellner, Plaintiff was advised that group therapy would be beneficial for her anxiety issues. Despite the need for treatment, Dr. Wellner inexplicably and unlawfully advised Plaintiff that she could not attend these sessions with her service animal. It is important to note that Defendant Kaiser had originally diagnosed and prescribed Plaintiff with the need for a service animal.
- 15. The undisputed facts readily demonstrate that Defendants engaged in a pattern of discrimination against Plaintiff.

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FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

Against All Defendants

UNRUH CIVIL RIGHTS ACT

[Cal. Civ. C § 51 et seq.]

- 16. Plaintiff repeats and realleges by reference each and every allegation contained in paragraphs 1 through 15 of this Complaint, and incorporates the same as though fully set forth herein.
- 17. California's Unruh Civil Rights Act provides: "All persons within the jurisdiction of this state are free and equal, and no matter what their... disability [or] medical condition, are entitled to the full and equal accommodations, advantages, facilities, privileges, or services in all business establishments of every kind whatsoever." Cal. Civ. C. § 51 (b).
 - 18. Plaintiff is a person with a disability within the meaning of the Unruh Act.
- 19. Defendant Kaiser's hospital and medical facility are "business establishments" within the meaning of the Unruh Act.
- 20. By virtue of the acts and omissions alleged herein, Defendants have violated and continue to violate the Unruh Act.
- 21. Plaintiff is entitled to declaratory and injunctive relief as well as reasonable attorneys' fees and costs. Cal. Civ. 6 § 52 (a).
- 22. Defendants are liable up to a maximum of three times the amount of Plaintiff's actual damages, including emotional distress damages determined by the jury, and in no case less than four thousand (\$4,000) per violation. Cal. Civ. C. § 52 (a).
 - 23. WHEREFORE, Plaintiff requests relief as hereinafter provided.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

Against All Defendants

Violation of the Disabled Persons Act

[Cal. Civ. C. § 54 et seq.]

- 24. Plaintiff repeats and realleges by reference each and every allegation contained in paragraphs 1 through 23 of this Complaint, and incorporates the same as though fully set forth herein.
- 25. California's Disabled Persons Act provides: "Individuals with disabilities shall be entitled to full and equal access, as other members of the general public, to accommodations, advantages, facilities, medical facilities, including hospitals, clinics, and physicians' offices, and privileges of all common carriers, airplanes, motor vehicles, railroad trains, motorbuses, streetcars, boats, or any other public conveyances or modes of transportation (whether private, public, franchised, licensed, contracted, or otherwise provided), telephone accilities, adoption agencies, private schools, hotels, lodging places, places of public accommodation, amusement, or resort, and other places to which the general public is invited, subject only to the conditions and limitations established by law, or state or federal regulation, and applicable alike to all persons." Cal. Civ. C. § 54.1 (a)(1).
- 26. Defendant Kaiser's hospital and medical facility are medical facilities covered by the protections of the Disabled Persons Act.
- 27. By virtue of the acts and omissions alleged herein, Defendants have violated the Disabled Persons Act:
- 28. Defendants are liable up to a maximum of three times the amount of Plaintiff's actual damages, including emotional distress damages determined by the jury, and in no case less than one thousand (\$1,000) per violation. Cal. Civ. C. § 54.1.
 - 29. Plaintiff is entitled to reasonable attorneys' fees and costs. Cal. Civ. C. § 54.3.

30. WHEREFORE, Plaintiff requests relief as hereinafter provided.

THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION

Against All Defendants

Intentional Infliction of Emotional Distress

- 31. Plaintiff repeats and realleges the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 30, and incorporates the same by reference as though fully set forth herein.
- 32. Defendants' acts and omissions as alleged herein constitute extreme and outrageous conduct having no place in a civil society.
- 33. Defendants' acts and omissions alleged herein intentionally caused or recklessly disregarded the probability of causing severe emotional distress.
- 34. Defendants' acts and omissions alleged herein actually and proximately caused Plaintiff's emotional distress.
- 35. By virtue of Defendants' acts and oraissions as alleged herein, Plaintiff is entitled to preliminary and permanent injunctive relief.
 - 36. WHEREFORE, Plaintiff requests relief as hereinafter provided.

FOURTH CAUSE OF ACTION

Against All Defendants

Negligence

- 37. Plaintiff repeats and realleges the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 36, and incorporates the same by reference as though fully set forth herein.
- 38. Defendants had a duty to plaintiff and the class of people of which she is a member to train its respective employees, partners, and agents on the laws protecting disabled persons in places of public accommodations.

- 39. Defendants breached their respective duties to plaintiff and the class of people of which she is a member by failing to train its respective employees, partners, and agents on the laws protecting disabled persons in places of public accommodations.
- 40. As a result of Defendants' respective and collective breach of duties to plaintiff, plaintiff has sustained serious and permanent injuries to her person, all to her damage in the amount to be shown according to proof at trial.
- 41. As a direct and proximate result of such acts of Defendants and DOES I through 50, Plaintiff was compelled to and did employ the services of physicians to care for and treat her, and did incur medical, professional and incidental expenses. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and upon such information and belief alleges, that she will incur additional like expenses for an indefinite period of time in the future, all to Plaintiff's damage in a sum to be proven at trial.
 - 42. WHEREFORE, Plaintiff requests relief as hereinafter provided.

FIFTH CAUSE OF ACTION

Against All Defendants

Assault

- 43. Plaintiff repeats and realleges by reference each and every allegation contained in paragraphs 1 through 42 and incorporates the same herein as though fully set forth.
- 44. On or about March 26, 2016, Mr. Chisholm, intentionally, willfully, wantonly and maliciously caused Plaintiff to reasonably believe that she was in threat of imminent harm. Given the fact that Mr. Chisholm continued to berate Plaintiff and follow her into an enclosed space, a reasonable person in Plaintiff's situation would have been offended by the fear of imminent harm.

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- 45. At all relevant times, herein Mr. Chisolm's conduct was within the course and scope of his employment and/or agency with Defendants, making Defendants liable for such acts committed by Mr. Chisolm as alleged herein.
- 46. At no time during the events described in the preceding paragraph, did the Plaintiff consent to any of Defendants' employees and DOES 1 through 50, threatened conduct.
- 47. As a direct and proximate result of Defendants' and DOES 1 through 50, threatening manner, coupled with the present ability to carry out imminent harm, Plaintiff felt the imminent apprehension of such conduct and therefore, she suffered severe emotional distress and other injuries to her person in an amount to be shown according to proof at trial.
- 48. As a direct, legal and proximate result of the actions of Defendants, and DOES 1 through 50, Plaintiff sustained serious and permanent injuries to her person, all to her damage in the amount to be shown according to proof at trial.
- 49. As a direct and proximate result of such acts of Defendants and DOES 1 through 50, Plaintiff was compelled to and did employ the services of physicians to care for and treat her, and did incur medical, professional and incidental expenses. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and upon such information and belief alleges, that she will incur additional like expenses for an indefinite period of time in the future, all to Plaintiff's damage in a sum to be proven at trial.
- Plaintiff is informed and believes, and alleges thereon that such acts directed toward the Plaintiff were malicious and belligerent. The acts of Defendants' employee were done with a conscious disregard for Plaintiff's right to be free from such tortuous and criminal behavior, such as to constitute oppression, fraud or malice pursuant to Cal. Civ. C. § 3294. Further, such acts were ratified and/or authorized by managing agents of Defendants, entitling Plaintiff to punitive damages in an amount appropriate to punish and set an example of Defendants and Does 1 through 50.

51. WHEREFORE, Plaintiff requests relief as hereinafter provided.

SIXH CAUSE OF ACTION

Against All Defendants

False Imprisonment

- 52. Plaintiff repeats and realleges by reference each and every allegation contained in paragraphs 1 through 51 and incorporates the same herein as though fully set forth.
- 53. During the period described above, Defendants, through the actions of Mr. Chisholm, forced Plaintiff into an enclosed space and required her to stay against her will without her consent and over her number protests to be left alone.
- 54. Defendants, through the actions of Mr. Chisholm, used this effective confinement to try to frighten, intimidate and manipulate Plaintiff into leaving Defendant Kaiser's facility. Defendants' forcible detention of the Plaintiff was arbitrary, capricious and done with the purpose of restraining Plaintiff's present and future activities at Defendant Kaiser's facility.
- 55. At no time did Plaintiff consent to this act by the Defendants. As a proximate result of these actions, Plaintiff sustained injuries, both physical and mental, and thus, have suffered general damages. In addition, as a further proximate result of Defendants' acts, Plaintiff has incurred and will continue to incur expenses for medical and psychological services. The full of amount of such services is not known to the Plaintiff at this time.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff prays judgment against all Defendants as follows:

- A declaration that Defendants' conduct as alleged herein violated the Unruh
 Civil Rights Act;
- For appropriate preliminary and permanent injunctive relief pursuant to the
 Unruh Civil Rights Act;
