II. THE PARTIES

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- 2. At all times herein mentioned, Plaintiff Goar Aloyan ("Mrs. Aloyan"), an individual, was the wife of decedent, Trdat Arakelyan ("Mr. Arakelyan"), a patient of Defendants, and a resident of the County of Los Angeles.
- 3. Based on information and belief, at all times herein mentioned, Defendant Kaiser Foundation Health Plan, a California Medical corporation, was an association of physicians and surgeons duly authorized to practice medicine with an Emergency Department, with its principal place of business in Los Angeles County, California.
- 4. Based on information and belief, at all times herein mentioned, Defendant Kaiser Permanente, a California Medical corporation was an association of physicians and surgeons duly authorized to practice medicine with an Emergency Department, with its principal place of business in Los Angeles County, California.
- 5. Based on information and belief, at all times herein mentioned, Defendant Jocelyn S. Basililo, an individual, was employed by the other named defendants as a registered nurse in Defendant's Emergency Department in Los Angeles County, California.
- 6. Plaintiff is unaware of the true names and capacities of DOES 1 through 20, inclusive, and therefore sues them by fictitious names. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and on the basis of that information and belief alleges, that each of these defendants was in some manner negligently and proximately responsible for the events and happenings alleged in this complaint and for plaintiff's injuries and damages.
- Plaintiff is informed and believes, and on the basis of that information and belief alleges, that at all times mentioned in this complaint, defendants, and DOES 1 through 20 were the agents and employees of their codefendants, and in doing the acts alleged in this complaint were acting within the course and scope of that agency and employment. Each defendant, when acting as a principal, was negligent in the selection and hiring of each other defendant as an agent or employee.

III. JURISDICTION AND VENUE.

- 8. The Defendants' acts, including but not limited to the professional negligence and medical malpractice that caused Plaintiff's damages as alleged herein all occurred in the County of Los Angeles, State of California.
- 9. This Court has jurisdiction over the present matter because, as delineated within this complaint, the nature of the claims and amounts in controversy meet the requirements for jurisdiction in the Superior Court of Los Angeles.
- 10. On October 25, 2011, plaintiff served notice, pursuant to CCP §364, to defendants of plaintiff's intention to sue them for professional regligence.

IV. FACTS

- 11. On Friday, September 23, 2011, decedent, Trdat Arakelyan, was a passenger in a car being driven by his wife, Goar Aloyan, when he began complaining of severe chest pain. Mrs. Aloyan immediately recognized her husband's grave medical condition because she is very familiar with heart attack symptoms due to her employment experience at a cardiologist's office. Hence, she quickly turned the car around and rushed him to the nearest hospital Kaiser Remanente Hospital located at 13652 Cantara Street in Panorama City.
- 12. At approximately 8:40 p.m., Mrs. Aloyan pulled up to the curb at Kaiser's Emergency facility, so that her husband would not lose any time getting immediate medical assistance. Mr. Arakelyan exited the car and headed into the hospital for help while his wife went to park the car.
- 13. FROM THE INSTANT MR. ARAKELYAN ENTERED KAISER'S EMERGENCY WAITING ROOM AT 8:40 P.M., EVERY SECOND OF THE TRAGEDY THAT ENSUED HAS BEEN CAPTURED BY VIDEO SURVEILLANCE FOOTAGE.¹
- 14. Upon entering the emergency room, Mr. Arakelyan walked directly to the intake nurse, Jocelyn Basililo, and informed her of his severe chest pain, shortness of breath, and profuse sweating. Rather than immediately assessing the severity of Mr. Arakelyan's

life threatening symptoms at triage, the receptionist negligently handed Mr. Arakelyan numerous forms and instructed him to be seated and fill out the forms before he would be helped.

- 15. Mr. Arakelyan was left with no choice. Still experiencing and exhibiting numerous symptoms of a heart attack, he unwillingly complied and sat immediately across the reception nurse in the empty waiting room with the paperwork clenched in one hand, with his other hand cradling his chest. He leaned back and rested his head on his chair to lessen the chest pains he was enduring.
- 16. Having parked the car, Mrs. Aloyan rushed into the waiting room at approximately 8:42 p.m., and was surprised to find her husband still seated in the empty waiting room in pain and distress. After quickly checking on him, she immediately waiked over to the reception window and demanded that they admit her husband. She too was given no other option but to return to the empty waiting room to wait and fill out his paperwork.
- 17. Although she walked back to be at her husband's side, noticing his severe pain, Mrs. Aloyan again anxiously walked back to the reception window around 8:43 p.m. and again demand immediate medical assistance. Mr. Arakelyan still remained helpless and in pain in his shar.
- 18. Unfortunately, while being ignored and denied treatment by the Emergency Room staff, at 8:45 p.m., while seated in the empty waiting room, Mr. Arakelyan went into cardiac arrest and collapsed. His limp body slid down off his chair.
- 19. Using all her strength, Mrs. Aloyan attempted by herself to lift her husband, but his body remained limp. Panic ensued in the waiting room. An unknown gentleman who witnessed what was going on ran over to help Mrs. Aloyan as she was struggling to lift her husband. The concerned man waved at a security guard who was seated near the reception window, for help. The man took a second look at Mr. Arakelyan and began angrily yelling in the direction of the reception window. At 8:46 p.m., three hospital employees

finally came out and began attempting to lift Mr. Arakelyan. Nurses also then appeared with a stretcher and lifted Mr. Arakelyan onto the stretcher.

20. Mrs. Aloyan powerlessly stood at the foot of the stretcher and watched as the nurses placed her husband's body on the stretcher. The nurses rolled Trdat Arakelyan away from the waiting room and Mrs. Aloyan followed them. At some time thereafter, CPR was initiated and Code Blue was finally called. Mr. Arakelyan by this point had no pulse. After further time, Mr. Arakelyan was administered medication and multiple shocks but remained pulseless and unresponsive. Shortly thereafter he was pronounced dead.

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

MEDICAL MALPRACTICE (PROFESSIONAL NEGLIGENCE)

(Goar Aloyan Against All Defendants and DOES 1 through 20)

- 21. Plaintiff repeats and realleges each of the allegations contained in the preceding paragraphs 1 through 20 and incorporates same as though fully set forth herein.
- 22. On September 23, 2011, Mr. Arakelyan arrived at Defendants' emergency department seeking immediate medical attention for his severe chest pain. Defendants had a duty to use such skill, prudence, and diligence as other emergency facilities in the same or similar locality in similar circumstances commonly possess and exercise, and to provide such immediate care to patients like Mr. Arakelyan.
- Defendants failed to exercise their duty to assess the level of risk that Mr. Arakelyan presented and to provide the appropriate diagnosis and care. In assessing the level of risk that Mr. Arakelyan presented, Defendants should have immediately admitted Mr. Arakelyan to the emergency department and conducted an EKG to be analyzed by a physician. Following an EKG that would have undoubtedly shown that Mr. Arakelyan was is severe cardiac distress, a physician should have administered various forms of medication and performed the necessary procedures commonly employed to avoid death resulting from a heart attack.

- At all times mentioned in this complaint, Defendants were negligent in that they failed to possess and exercise, in both diagnosis and treatment, the reasonable degree of knowledge and skill that is ordinarily possessed and exercised by other emergency department nurses and physicians in the same or similar locality under similar circumstances, in that, among other things, Defendants breached that duty by failing to triage Mr. Arakelyan as a patient suffering a severe cardiac emergency. Defendants negligently dismissed Mr. Arakelyan's request for immediate medical attention and instead told him to fill out forms and wait to be seen. Mr. Arakelyan should not have been forced to wait and fill out paperwork while suffering a heart attack. Given his age, gender, chief complaints and physical appearance, the Defendants should have clearly recognized the grave possibility that Mr. Arakelyan was suffering a heart attack.
- 25. Defendant Basililo and the emergency room staff failed to accurately triage Mr. Arakelyan while he was in severe pain and cardiac distress.
- 26. Defendant Basililo and all other emergency room admitting staff again failed to recognize the urgency of the situation even after the Goar Aloyan entered the emergency room reception area and translically explained the situation and demanded immediate medical attention several times. Defendant Basililo and the emergency room staff failed to provide the necessary medical attention that Mr. Arakelyan required.
- 27. Defendants' negligent conduct in failing to provide Mr. Arakelyan with emergency medical assistance was a proximate cause of Mr. Arakelyan's death. It is common practice for emergency departments to provide immediate assessment and care even when presented with acute cardiac syndromes. There exist numerous procedures in preventing death from a heart attack but none were timely nor properly employed to save Mr. Arakelyan's life. At intake, Defendant failed to recognize the extremely high level of risk that Mr. Arakelyan presented. In the failure to recognize the risk level, the Defendant failed the first step in triage. As a result of refusing to immediately admit Mr. Arakelyan, none of the immediate procedures available in diagnosing cardiac distress were utilized either.

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and other Emergency Department staff, to provide emergency medical services to any member of the public who came to the hospital with urgent medical problems.

- 35. On September 23, 2011, at approximately 8:40 p.m., decedent, Mr. Arakelyan was brought to Defendants' Emergency Department, seeking immediate care and treatment for heart attack symptoms including severe chest pain, epigastric pain and profuse sweating.
- 36. Mr. Arakelyan was visibly in severe pain and distress. He explained the details of his symptoms to Defendant Basililo and the hospital staff. Despite Mr. Arakelyan's pleas, Defendants failed to determine that the decedent was suffering a cardiac emergency. Rather than immediately providing the urgent medical treatment that he required, Defendants instructed the decedent to sit, wait, and fill out forms.
- 37. As a proximate result of Defendants' negligent failure to provide Mr. Arakelyan the necessary emergency medical services, and as a proximate result of the delay that Defendants' negligence caused, Mr. Arakelyan died.

POURTH CAUSE OF ACTION

LOSS OF CONSORTIUM

(Goar Aloyan Against All Defendants and DOES 1 through 20)

- 38. Plaintiff repeats and realleges each of the allegations contained in the preceding paragraphs 1 through 38 and incorporates the same as though fully set forth herein.
- 39. Mrs. Aloyan was caused to be deprived of the love, affection, services, comfort, solace, assistance, consortium, companionship of her spouse, all to her damage, inconvenience, discomfort and loss in an amount and extent subject to proof and beyond the jurisdictional minimum of this Court, as a result of Defendants' conduct in causing the death of her husband, Trdat Arakelyan.
- 40. Mrs. Aloyan also suffered immense hard, mental anguish, and emotional distress as she watched her husband suffer through pain and ultimately, his death.

41. Mrs. Aloyan was further caused and continues to be deprived of and denied the full enjoyment of her marital state all to her damage, as a result of the negligent conduct of Defendants in causing the above referenced death of her husband. Mrs. Aloyan suffered actual damages in an amount to be proven at trial.

FIFTH CAUSE OF ACTION

NEGLIGENT INFLICTION OF EMOTIONAL DISTRESS

(Goar Aloyan Against All Defendants and DOES 1 through 20)

- 42. Plaintiff repeats and realleges each of the allegations contained in the preceding paragraphs 1 through 42 and incorporates the same as though fully set forth herein.
- Department and was aware that, while her husband in Defendant's Emergency Department and was aware that, while her husband was suffering a severe medical emergency, the Defendants were ignoring his pleas for help. Mrs. Aloyan witnessed her husband suffer through severe chest pain, profuse sweating and shortness of breath, while Defendants refused to provide any assistance. She realized her husband's life was at risk and that his unassisted condition could become lethal, but she was helpless. Mrs. Aloyan tried to intervene and seek assistance herself, but the Defendants maintained their refusal to attend to Mr. Alakelyan's emergency condition. Mrs. Aloyan's fears soon became reality when her husband slumped to his death beside her.
- Mrs. Aloyan suffered severe emotional distress as a result of witnessing the helpless suffering and ultimate death of her husband. The Defendants' negligence in failing to provide Mr. Arakelyan with emergency medical assistance was a proximate cause of his death.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Goar Aloyan prays for a judgment against Defendants, and each of them as follows:

1. For special damages, according to proof; 2. For general damages in an amount according to proof; For costs of suit herein incurred; 3. 4. For prejudgment interest; and 5.
